Rabbits & Hedgehogs Class

English	We will practise reading and writing our names and start to learn letters and sounds in daily phonics sessions. We will encourage and build on mark making in preparation to write with daily activities focusing on strengthening their fine motor muscles. We will listen to and role play stories and rhymes to develop new vocabulary to help us to read.
Maths	We will focus on number recognition to 10 in many forms. We will learn amount/numeral correspondence and be able to physically count an amount of objects accurately. We also look at identifying basic 2D and 3D shapes and identifying shapes within shapes.
Topics	In our topics this term, we will be covering the following topics - All about me, My Family and Myself, Where I Live, People who Help Us and Our Community through the Year. These topics will help children develop the key areas in the EYFS framework: Communication and Language, Personal, Social and Emotional Development, Physical Development, Understanding the World and Expressive Arts and Design.
