## Year One

## Autumn Term 2 Newsletter

| English | This term we are continuing with our third person past tense <br> story retells including a beginning, middle and an end. We will <br> write in simple sentences starting with a time word such as <br> first, next, then, after that and finally or an opener including <br> the, she, he and it. We will move onto using capital letters for <br> names of people and using an adjective to describe a noun. <br> Finally we will write a recount of a winter walk and write <br> instructions for making a jam sandwich. |
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| Maths | This term we will continue with addition and subtraction. We <br> will then be recognising, sorting and reasoning about 3D and <br> 2D shapes. We will develop shape patterns building on our <br> skills. Our numbers work continues - this time using numbers <br> up to 20 to count, compare, order and partition into tens and <br> ones. |
| Science | In science, we are learning about animals and their needs. We <br> will be grouping animals by type - mammals, reptiles, <br> amphibians, fish and birds. We will then look at what they eat <br> and how animal teeth help us to identify what they eat. Lastly <br> we will be looking at animals as pets. |
| Foundation <br> subjects | Art - we will be exploring line and the idea that lines are a <br> basic tool for artists. We will explore different lines such a <br> straight, zig zag and wavy line. We will investigate the work of <br> Rembrandt, Miro and Klee which all show how lines can be <br> used to show different things, ranging from simple shapes and <br> objects to representing dreams and patterns. The children will <br> look at how artists can use different materials to make lines, <br> not only using pencils, pens and paint but by using 3D media, <br> such as string. <br> History - our first history unit introduces the children to history <br> which can help them to understand what a historian is, what an <br> archaeologist is and how sources and evidence help to uncover <br> facts about the past. We will do this by looking at pictures and <br> listening to stories and will begin to understand that there <br> were lives lived before ours. |

|  | PSHE - we will be looking at what it means to be British. We <br> begin with exploring ways which we can help our school <br> community and then how to be a good neighbour, identifying <br> things that can harm our neighbourhood, describing what it is <br> like to live in the British Isles and how people living in the <br> British Isles can be the same and different. <br> DT - we will be continuing with our cooking and learning to <br> make jam tarts. <br> RE - we will be looking at people who are special to us and <br> significant or special in Christianity and Judaism. |
