Year 5

Spring Term 1 Newsletter

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	This half term we are continuing with our 'I'm a Clever Writer' approach in writing.
	Our English lessons will focus on the skills we are developing in order to be a
	successful year 5 writer. We will use a range of stories, videos and historical figures
	who link to our history topic as a stimulus for our writing, including Marie
	Antoinette and Napoleon. We will continue to build on our writing of setting and
	character descriptions, as well as learning the skills to write persuasive letters and
English	instructions.
	We will also have daily guided reading sessions which involve reading with the
	teacher and completing a range of reading activities about the selected text. In 5W
	we will begin reading 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo, and in 5CH we will
	read 'Street Child' by Berlie Doherty. Please encourage your child to read at home
	at least three times a week to an adult and fill in their homework diaries, which
	need to come into school every Friday.
Maths	This half term, children will build on their understanding of multiplication and
	division. They will learn how to multiply 4 digits by 1 digit, multiply 2 digits (area
	model), multiply 2 digits by 3 digits and multiply 4 digits by 2 digits. Similarly, they
	will learn to divide 3 digits by 1 digit, 4 digits by 1 digit and divide with remainders.
	Multistep word problems will be incorporated to ensure children can answer these
	questions in context.
	We still ask that all children practice their times tables regularly. The expectation in
	year 5 is that children know their times tables fluently up to 12 x 12.
